experience of the difference a small grant from that Fund could make for a vulnerable member of the community.

• He loved to drop into the Aviv, Kandu and Thistle Clubs where he would chat to old friends and check that everyone was being well cared for.

We shall all miss George very much. It was my privilege to serve under his leadership for only 15 months and yet I feel as though I have lost a life-long mentor and friend: he will not be forgotten. Our thoughts are with Angela and all the family.

Helping refugees

JCS plays a pivotal role in helping Jewish refugees get back on their feet and settled into Scotland. So far in 2016 we have supported 23 refugees. The map below depicts the different countries they have travelled from to Scotland.

JCS works closely with the Home Office and the Rabbi to

help people integrate into the community and take back control of their own lives. JCS help with finding homes, jobs and access to education; we also make sure that there is someone looking out for them.

Rosh Hashanah Food Parcels

Each week 19 families access our kosher foodbank. It runs throughout the entire year to make sure that no one in the community goes hungry. Dedicated volunteers keep the foodbank cupboard well stocked with regular shopping trips that are funded by donations.

It can be particularly challenging during holidays when certain foodstuffs are normally enjoyed but can be costly. Last year we provided 15 food parcels for Rosh Hashanah for those most in need within the community; we aim to make the same amount this year.


This year's parcels will include honey, apples and other traditional Rosh Hashanah foodstuffs.
