Jewish Care Scotland – Community at our heart

Last year when I wrote my introduction to our Annual Review and commented that we were looking forward to developing some of our ideas in 2020, none of us could have predicted just how the year would unfold. I think we would all agree that 2020 was a tough year for everyone, bringing a number of challenges that we could never have predicted, nor prepared for. I am however immensely proud of our team here at JCS, who have risen to every challenge with compassion and conviction and who have continued to support those who need us when they needed us most.

After a positive start to the year, with our team out and about, hosting information events, visiting with community groups and our clubs getting involved in lots of activities, our services were forced to pause in March 2020. When it became clear that the temporary restrictions would last longer than we had all originally hoped, we knew immediately that we had to adapt our service model to ensure nobody suffered through being socially isolated, or without adequate support.

Our dedicated team made time to speak with individuals and their families within our community, to identify with them, what support, and services would make a difference to their wellbeing throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. Not only did we listen but we also acted. By April we had established welfare calls, doorstep visits, shopping deliveries and helped people get to medical appointments. Our building-based services may have stopped, but we certainly did not. By July we had adapted our services again to bring care, support, and companionship into the homes of those who most needed us, offering this as an additional service. The feedback from this new addition has been exceptionally positive and I am delighted to report that it is making a huge difference to people's emotional wellbeing and sense of connection, which is priceless.



However, it hasn't been easy, and we have continued to work hard despite significant financial impact. The pandemic has meant that we have experienced a significant loss in forecast income as a result of government enforced cancellations of fundraising events and building closures. We have, however, been delighted to be supported by such a committed community who together have given us a huge amount of support and donations specifically to help with

our COVID-19 response. This kindness and generosity has allowed us to offer essential services such as kosher foodbank deliveries, deliveries of kosher meals to those who otherwise would struggle to have a meal each day, and to keep our clients connected to their Jewish culture with deliveries of the Jewish Telegraph.

As restrictions ease, the next 12 months look promising as we continue to work with our clients, our community, and our volunteers to listen to what they need moving forward. Our volunteers will have a central role in supporting and creating a cohesive community as we look to support them to run a new volunteer-led drop-in café twice weekly, and we also hope that they will facilitate daily activities such as a local walking group, book club or discussion groups. This will allow our staff to continue to deliver registered day care and provide support visits in the home for our most vulnerable.



2020 has brought JCS many challenges and setbacks, but we've used this time as a learning opportunity to continue to make a difference not only now but also in the future. Our relationships with clients, families and the community are stronger as we've continued to learn and listen to each other through the toughest of times.

I am pleased to see such positivity in the pages and photos of this annual review. We've come together in ways that show the generosity of our supporters and the hugely positive impact that JCS has made to so many in the past year.

For that myself, the Board, the staff and our volunteers are grateful beyond words: thank you.


Our Services

Jewish Care Scotland exists to meet the needs of those within the Jewish community who require care and support. Until March 2020 this was predominately delivered within our day services and community services. Additional support for those struggling financially through the provision of our financial assistance programme was also in place.


Jewish Care Scotland's model of care had to change significantly following the first lockdown of March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. In March 2020 we temporarily changed our model of care to deliver social support to people in their own home. This involved helping with shopping, supporting people to attend appointments, and generally creating an engaging environment for many who live alone, often without any other interaction with others.

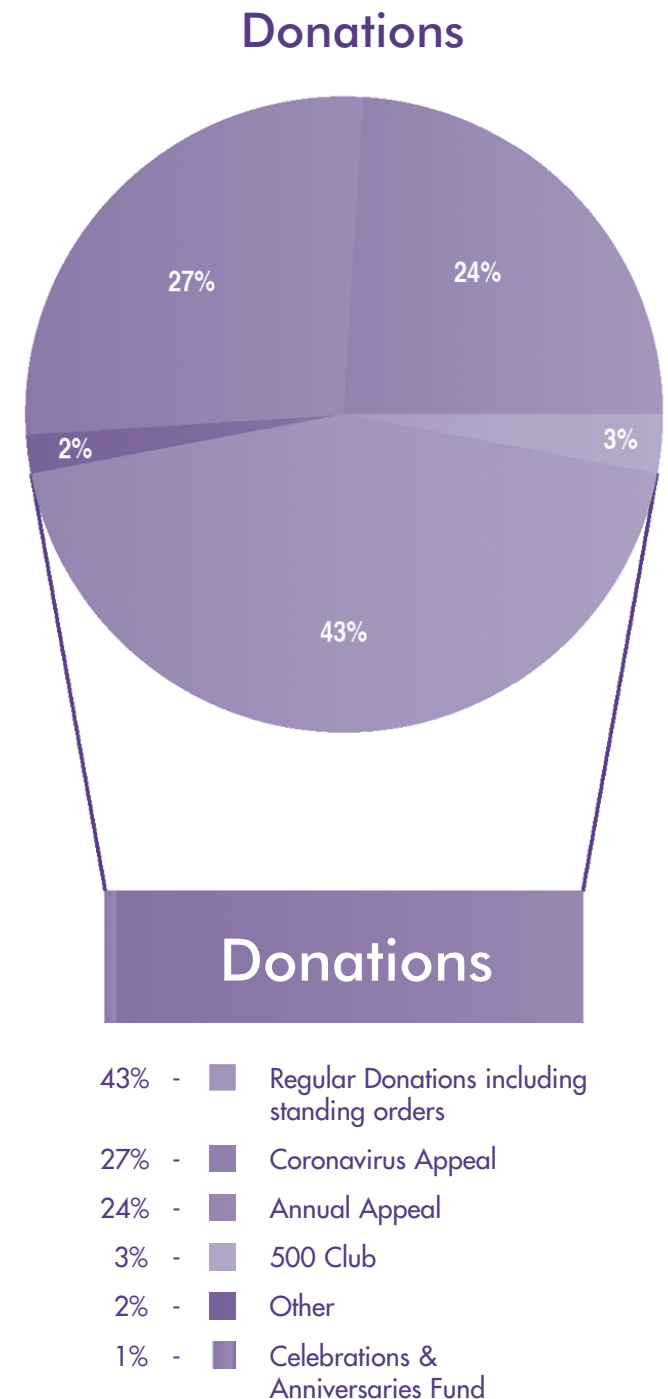
Our Finances

COVID-19 impacted our finances dramatically and you will notice a significant difference in our income and expenditure in 2020 due to this impact.

Notably, there was a shift from donations and fundraised income being our highest source of income in 2019 due to so many fundraising events, activities and opportunities being cancelled. Income from clubs and activities was also down due to the cancellation of our services from March 2020.

We received a substantial legacy gift towards the end of 2020 which accounts for the increase in this area.

There was also a shift from staff and governance costs being our highest expense, in 2020 our building and other overheads were higher due to some staff being furloughed throughout the pandemic.

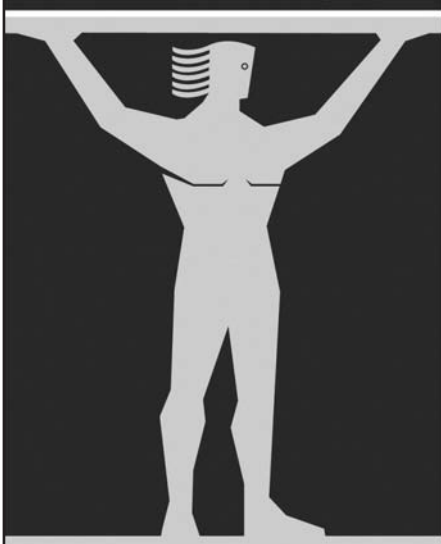
